I fielded a range of enquiries, from people wanting to know more about our <u>Age Friendly Creative Network</u> and Ambassadors project, to people wanting to join <u>TeaBooks</u> (our social book groups). I'd like to thank everyone who came over for a chat, to share both their enthusiasm for our work and their honesty with what we could do better. It was great that colleagues from other local teams at Age UK Oxfordshire were also in attendance, so when I was approached by someone wanting advice about purchasing her first mobile phone, I was able to take her over to meet members of our <u>Community Information Team</u>.

Having the opportunity to attend an in-person event was a really valuable experience. Being able to meet face-to-face makes any interaction more meaningful and memorable and being able to look into the other person's eyes and hear the nuance in their tone of voice is a much richer way to connect than in the virtual environment through a screen. It was an opportunity to be reminded of the stark reality that many people aren't online and, for some, events like this are a lifeline. I feel blessed to have been able to get out into the community to listen, and come away with ideas, inspiration, and action points for taking our work forward so even more older people can experience a creative later life.
